Jewelry Lost Wax Casting

ENCAUSTIC

Encaustic is one of the oldest forms of painting! Created by combining beeswax and resin, encaustic wax is applied hot, in layers that are then reheated to fuse or bond together. It's with this layering technique that encaustics can be incorporated with a wide range of other mediums or materials to create one-of-a-kind artwork with both texture and luminosity. No two pieces of encaustic art will ever be the same!

Painting with Hot Wax - Encaustic Workshop for Beginners

This workshop will explore encaustics by teaching a core understanding of fundamental techniques and different styles of application and design.
