The kids join Oran in singing to wake her up and discover her name is Clara Net ... Oran's clarinet! With more singing, clapping, dancing and drumming, children see all of the instruments onstage come to life and learn that making music means bringing their own character, humor and emotion to their artistry.

Amazing Magnets

Stellar Lunar


