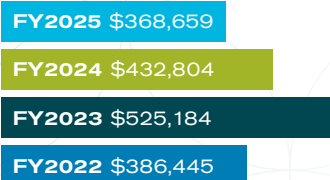

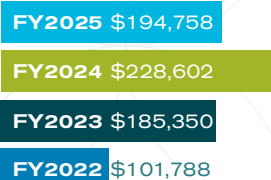

TRANSFORMATIONAL RENOVATION

We continued major facility upgrades while staying open for performances, education, and community events.

- / Auditorium renovations were completed to create more accessible seating and direct elevator access.
- / Facility renovations to the concessions and restrooms were completed, including new restrooms in the Donor Lounge.
- / FEMA support is helping us move forward with critical repair work to bring the Doan Center back into operation.
- / Capital campaign pledges of \$2,073,250 this year continued to advance long term accessibility and infrastructure goals.

PROGRAMMING & COLLABORATION

Strong attendance, added performances, and growing collaborations defined the season on our stages and in our community.

- / More than 400 performers auditioned across Center Stage Theatre, Youth Theatre, and Rising Stars.
- / Center Stage Theatre had a record number of season subscribers with sold out engagements of *The Wizard of Oz*, *Steel Magnolias*, and *The Diary of Anne Frank*.
- / Youth Theatre continued to grow, with performances of *Anne of Green Gables* and a sold-out run of *Matilda Jr.*, including an added performance.
- / Summer Art Fair welcomed 11,000+ visitors to Downtown Midland, our largest turnout yet.

MUSEUM EXPERIENCES & MIDLAND COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Even during construction, we delivered major exhibitions, hands-on experiences, and regional storytelling.

- / Over 12 immersive weeks, we hosted **Space Explorers: The Infinite**, a groundbreaking virtual-reality experience inspired by NASA missions, welcoming 16,416 visitors. Thanks to generous philanthropic underwriting, 4,316 students were able to experience space for just \$5 per student.
- / Our staff built supporting activities tied to curriculum to ignite curiosity and build the wonder of exploration within reach for thousands of learners.
- / We presented 6 additional exhibitions exploring science, art, and history.
- / The Midland County Historical Society continued collections care, exhibitions, programs, and publications to keep local history visible during renovation.

EDUCATION & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The Center expanded adult engagement opportunities and increased attendance at student matinee performances.

- / Adults enjoyed engagement opportunities, including *Brunch History* events and *Beyond the Exhibit* arts lecture series.
- / Student Matinee performances welcomed 2,938 teachers, students and chaperones for performing arts presentations.
- / 636 students participated in summer camp programs hosted at Midland Center for the Arts, Midland Public Schools, and Swan Valley Performing Arts Center.
- / 170 students participated in youth performing arts classes, workshops and productions.
